

#### **Knowledge Sharing & Application**

- Popular First Peoples, Second Class Treatment discussion paper is now most downloaded report released by Wellesley Institute
  - 250+ Community partnered research meetings (local, provincial, national, and international)
  - 130+ Media citations, including front page of the Toronto Star, CBC's The Current and The National, and Globe and Mail editorial
    - Physicians, hospital staff, and leadership trained in evidencebased cultural safety programs as part of the WLH Reconciling Relationships project
  - Dr. Smylie was called upon as an expert by parliamentary subcommittee and roundtables, federal ministers, national inquiries national and international expert advisory bodies

#### Impact during the pandemic

- **\$3.9M** Funding brought in to partner with SGMT and Na-Me-Res to open Auduzhe Mino Nesewinong (Place of Healthy Breathing)
- **9500+** COVID 19 vaccines administered at Auduzhe and partnering clinics
- **2000+** COVID 19 tests conducted at Auduzhe
  - 10+ Partners involved in a National First Nations, Inuit, and Métis COVID-19 Knowledge Network
- **\$200K** Distributed to community groups and organizations for knowledge mobilization staffing during COVID-19
  - 100+ Indigenous specific COVID-19 Resources (webinars, factsheets, reports, and databases) generated and new website launched for COVID-19 information and resource sharing (wecountcovid.com)
