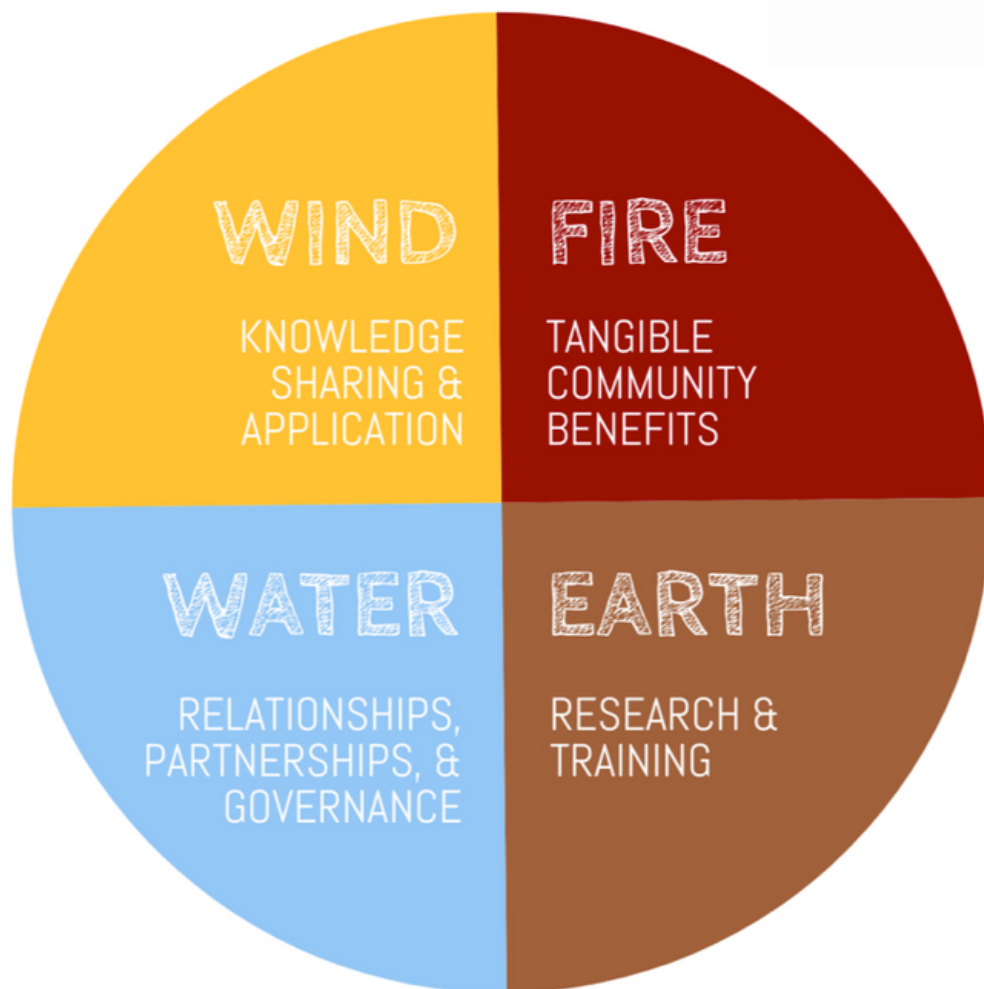

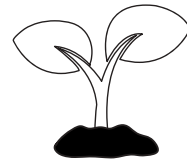


Relationships, Partnerships & Governance

COVID 19 RESPONSE

Impact during the pandemic

- \$3.9M** Funding brought in to partner with SGMT and Na-Me-Res to open Auduzhe Mino Nesewinong (Place of Healthy Breathing)
- 9500+** COVID 19 vaccines administered at Auduzhe and partnering clinics
- 2000+** COVID 19 tests conducted at Auduzhe
- 10+** Partners involved in a National First Nations, Inuit, and Métis COVID-19 Knowledge Network
- \$200K** Distributed to community groups and organizations for knowledge mobilization staffing during COVID-19
- 100+** Indigenous specific COVID-19 Resources (webinars, factsheets, reports, and databases) generated and new website launched for COVID-19 information and resource sharing (wecountcovid.com)
